#### **School Uniform**

Following consultation with children, parents, staff and governors, the school council are close to finalising our new uniform policy. Information to follow very soon.

#### **Lost Property**

The school council have taken over responsibility for the lost property box. They are happy to return items to their owners but they can only do this, if all items are labelled with the name of their current owner please. The school council will also regularly be putting out on the playground any unwanted, unnamed items you can claim.

#### Water bottles

As hopefully it gets warmer, please ensure your child has a water bottle in school everyday which contains water only, no other drinks are permitted.

#### **Book Fair**

Thank you for supporting the recent book fair. We raised £224 for new books.

#### **Unauthorised Holiday**

A reminder that any leave of absence will only be authorised by school if it has been applied for in advance and school believes the circumstances to be exceptional. A leave of absence during term time for the purposes of a holiday is not considered to qualify as exceptional and the absence will be recorded as unauthorised. Should an unauthorised absence take place, the school will inform the Local Authority and a Fixed Penalty Notice may then be issued in accordance with section 444 of the Education Act 1996. The law stipulates that the current penalty paid by parents/ carers is £60 when the penalty is paid within 21 days, increasing to £120 when the penalty is paid within the next 7 days (giving a total of 28 days to pay). This penalty is per parent/carer per child. If the Fixed Penalty is not paid you could be Prosecuted in the Magistrates' Court. When children are not in school before or after school holidays due to illness, we will ask for evidence to authorise the absence
